### **FUNDRAISER INFORMATION**

Please remember to ask family and friends if they can help you out with this year's fundraiser. All packets are due back September 4<sup>th</sup>. #### **Volunteers Need To Have License Scanned**

Per School District Policy, all volunteers must have their license/picture ID scanned. After your ID has been scanned, you will be given a name badge and allowed entrance to the building. Once you are in the system, we are able to retrieve your updated information on return visits to help expedite the process. You are only allowed to go to the area for which you signed in. Please do not go into another part of the building as classes are being held, and it is important to maintain the integrity of the academic day with as few distractions as possible.

**Snack Milk**: The cost is \$52.20 for the year. You have the option of white or chocolate milk. Snack Milk cannot be bought on a daily basis and is not part of the free and reduced program. This is strictly voluntary, you may choose to send your child to school with a water bottle or a drink.

**Lunch milk**: The cost is \$.30 and can be purchased in the lunchroom when lunch is brought from home. We ask that you try to send exact change. **Lunch milk**: If your child has purchased a lunch at school, the cost of the milk is included with the entrée.



#### **ICE CREAM**

Ice cream will be available to purchase in the lunchroom on Wednesdays and Fridays for \$1.00. Ice cream is not available to purchase through the lunch account. This is cash only. A note will be coming home letting you know which flavors are available and when the sale will begin. If your student forgets their money in the classroom, they will not able to go retrieve it. They may purchase it at the next ice cream sale.

All students will be having their pictures taken on October 3rd. As in the past, no order forms will be

filled out prior to taking pictures. If you choose not to order a picture package, your child's picture will still be included in the Memory Book and the Classroom Photo. **Retakes are November 1st.**

#### Calling Your Student Off of School

If your child is NOT in school, and we have not received a call, one of our secretaries will need to call you to verify his/her absence. If we cannot make contact with the parent/guardian, we will call the New Lenox Police Department, and they will make a well-being check to your home.

Please remember that if your child will be varying from their regular daily transportation, it is necessary to send a note to your child's teacher. If you need to make a change after your child has left for school, you may contact the Tyler Office, by 10:30 a.m. and we will notify the teacher of this change. Please be aware that children need consistency and changes at the end of the day can be confusing to your child and very disruptive to the class.



# **Dress Code**

All students are to wear clothing that completely covers their body from the shoulder to mid-thigh. Undergarments may not be visible. Clothing made of spandex or similar material may not be worn unless other clothing is worn over it. Shorts should come to your child's fingertips when they are standing with arms straight down at his/her sides. A top with spaghetti straps may only be worn if another shirt is worn over it. Tank tops with straps less than 3 fingers wide and shoe skates are NOT allowed. We also find that flip flops can be hazardous during recess and thus are not recommended for safe play.



# Back to School Health Reminder Lice

Return to school often means the return of head lice. During the summer, traveling & gatherings with friends and family often expose children to head lice more frequently than other times of the year. As a result, children often return to school with an unexpected case of these little pests which is why September has been named National Head Lice Prevention Month!

Lice cannot jump or fly but can reproduce rapidly. Lice develop in stages: nit (egg), nymph (baby lice), & louse (fully grown). The most common way lice are transmitted is by head-to-head contact with someone who has an active case of lice. This often occurs during sleepovers and close-play activities. Lice cannot survive for very long off the head. Therefore, it is not common for lice to spread by contact with personal items such as combs/brushes, hats, etc.

Because head lice are so common, especially at this time of the year, please take some time this week to check your child's head. The most common symptom is an itchy scalp. Nits appear as tiny, yellow/white teardrop-shaped eggs on the hair shaft. Adult lice are the size of a sesame seed, are tan-grayish white in color, and are most commonly found behind the ears and near the nape of the neck. If you find louse or nits, treat with an over-the-counter pediculocide (lice treatment). In order for the treatment to be effective, follow the instructions on the box exactly. Do not use the treatment more than recommended.

Please alert the school nurse if your child has lice or you suspect lice.

- Lunches at all grade levels will be ordered on a monthly basis.
- Only one lunch choice will be available each day at every grade level.
- Regular lunch (includes one milk) is \$3.50.
- Reduced Price Lunch ((includes one milk) is \$.40.
- Extra milks may be purchased for \$.30 each
- Students with account negative balances, including those that rolled over from last year, must be paid in full before a monthly order can be submitted.
- Lunches will be delivered fresh on a daily basis, according to the orders we receive and extras will not be available to students without an accepted order.
