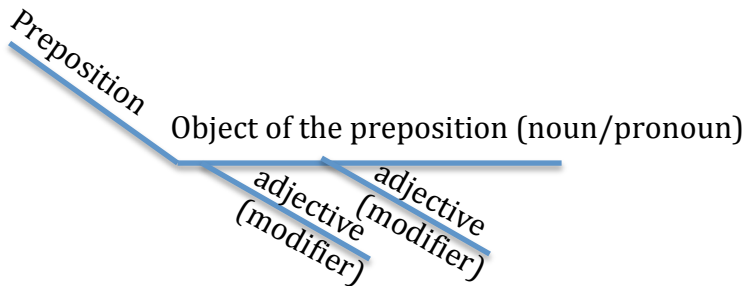
Action Verbs:



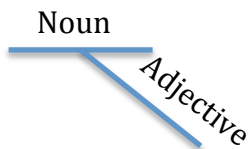
Linking Verbs:



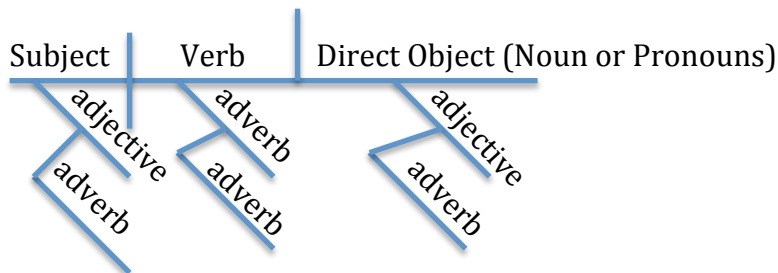
Prepositions: Diagram off of the subject or verb depending on what it is modifying



Adjectives: always describes a noun or pronoun. Answers the questions: Which one? What kind? How many? Its line will always come from the word it is describing.

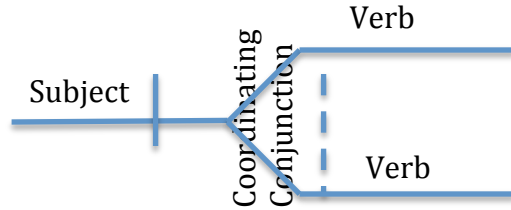


Adverbs: Describes verbs, adjectives, and other adverbs. (A.V.A) Answers the questions: Where? When? In what way? (How?) To what extent? Its line will also come from the word it is describing.

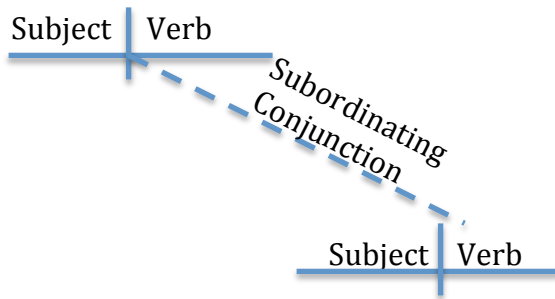


Conjunctions: connecting words

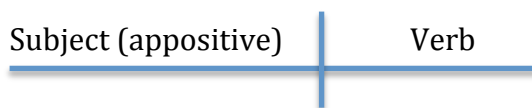
Coordinating Conjunctions- join elements that are the same. This is an example of a sentence with two verbs.



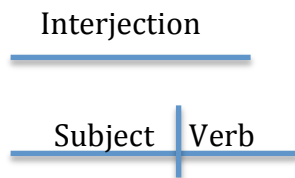
Subordinating Conjunctions- join dependent adverb clauses to independent clauses.



Appositives: Nouns that rename other nouns. Diagram them in parentheses after the noun they are renaming.
