

## Lesson 19: Interrogative Pronouns

Interrogative Pronouns :

Who  
whom  
What

Whose  
Which

These pronouns will REPLACE a noun.

They might function as a subject, direct object, object of the preposition.

Diagram interrogative pronouns according to their function (or job) in the sentence.

**EX 1** Who said that?

Who | said | that

**EX 2** Whom did they invite?  
They did invite whom.

They | did invite | Whom

**EX3** You do like which of the flavors best.  
Which of the flavors do you like best?

you | do like | which  
best | of flavors  
the

**EX4** What did Mrs. Davis want?  
Mrs. Davis did want what.

Mrs. Davis | did want | what

**EX5** whose hat is that? That is whose hat

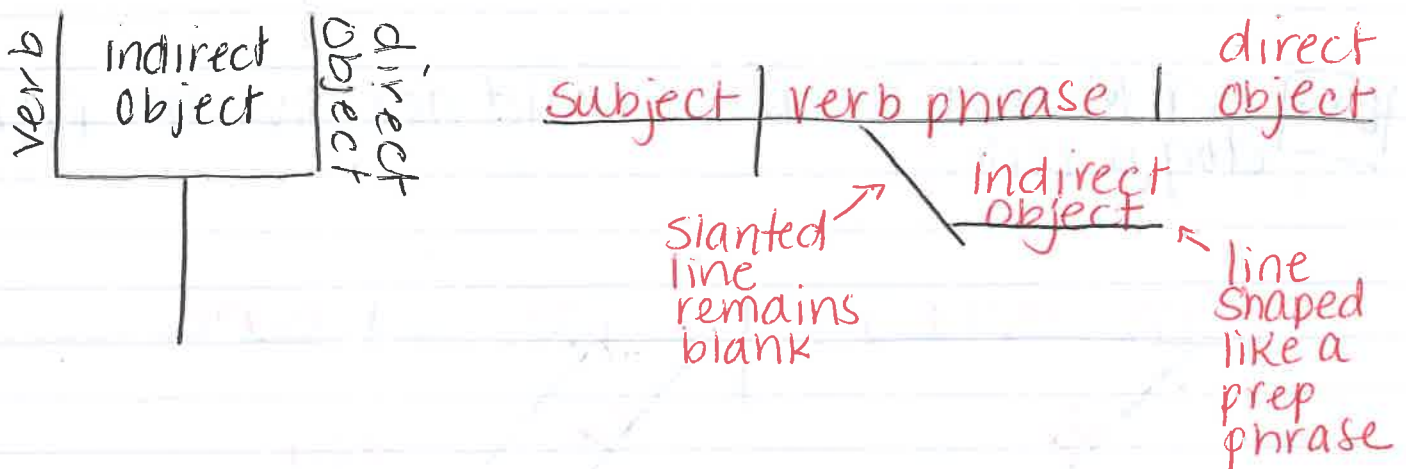

## Lesson 20: Indirect Objects

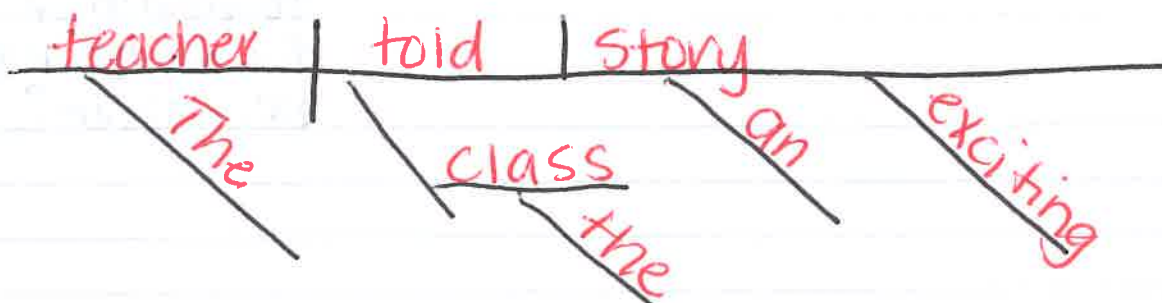
An **indirect object** indicates the person or thing to whom something is given, told, or shown.

### Rules for Indirect Objects:

1. It must be a **noun** or a **pronoun**
2. It must come between a verb and a direct object.
3. You must have a direct object in order to have an indirect object.
4. If the sentence has an indirect object, it will dangle under the verb.

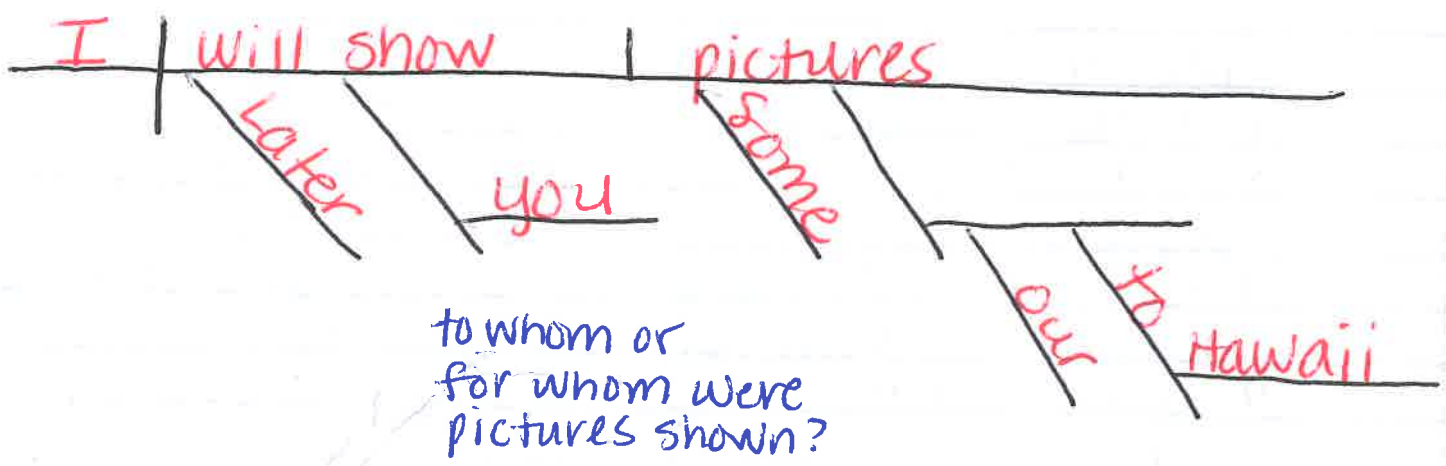


**EX1** The teacher told the class an exciting story.

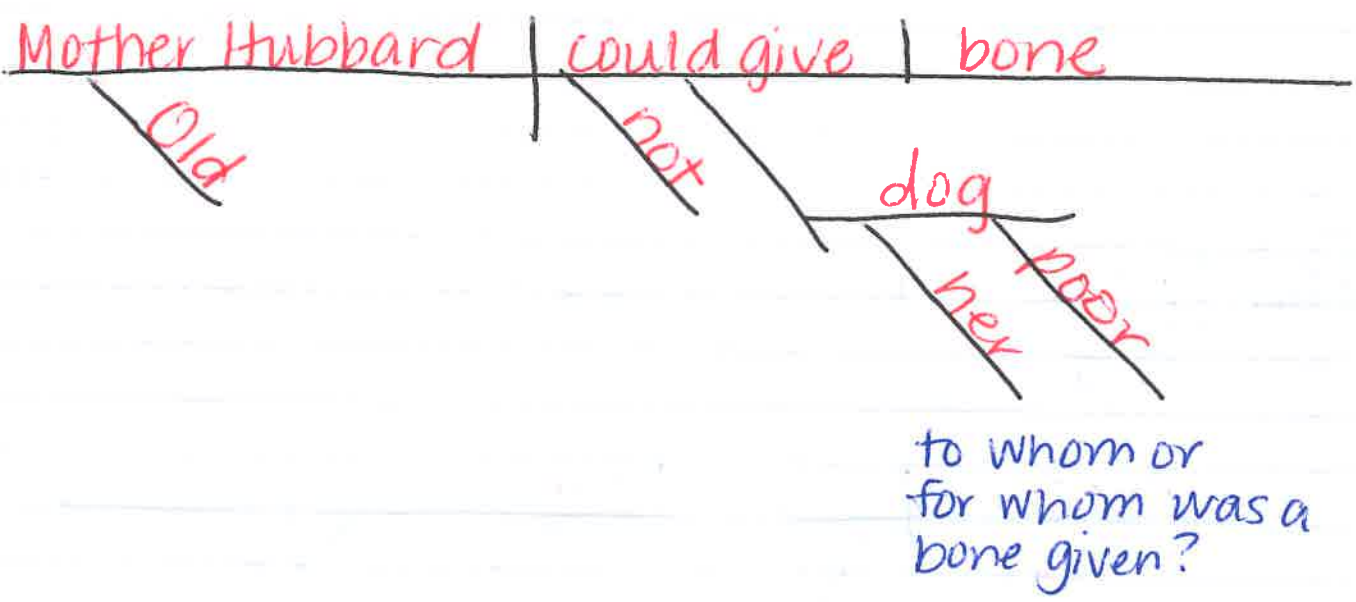


to whom or for whom was a story told?

EX2 Later, I will show you some pictures from our trip to Hawaii.



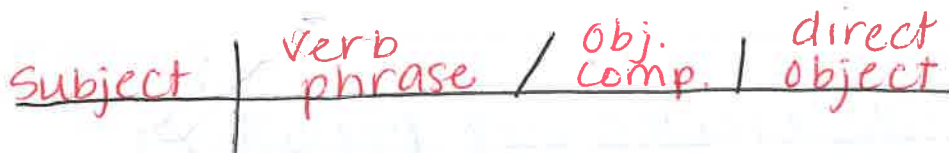
EX3 Old Mother Hubbard could not give her poor dog a bone.



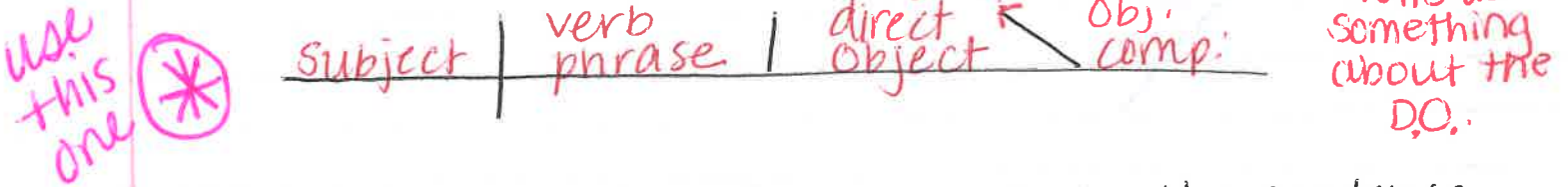
## Lesson 21: Objective Complements (See Lesson 7)

An objective complement is a noun or adjective that completes the verb and modifies, names, or renames the direct object only.

In diagramming, the objective complement, preceded by a slash, is placed before the direct object.



Another way to diagram the objective complement is to draw a backslash following the direct object.



It's about the order of the words in the sentence.

**EX1** They call him Chuck.



EX 2 Your comments made me angry.

comments | made | me | angry  
Your

EX 3 The class elected her president.

class | elected | her | president
