Dear students/parents,

We will be starting our Big 6 projects right when we get back from break. The students will have time this week and a little bit of next week to start looking into topics that they would be interested in researching. Final topic choices are <u>due on Wednesday</u>, <u>December 21st</u>. When researching, remind your child that they need to be able to narrow their topic down to be able to choose three main ideas to write about.

The project will include:

- a five-paragraph essay (introduction, three main idea paragraphs and a conclusion),
- a presentation (poster, PowerPoint, Keynote, video, etc.).

The Big 6 will contain the following steps:

- 1. Task Definition -- I need information
- 2. Information Seeking Strategies -- I need to seek the best resources
- 3. Locations and Access -- I need to find information in the sources
- 4. Use of Information -- I need to take notes and create citations
- 5. Synthesis -- I need to organize the relevant Information
- 6. Evaluation -- I need to judge the process and the presentation

Your child will be receiving a Big 6 packet that will be required to be completed throughout the research process. They will also receive a rubric that will allow them to see what the expectations are for each part.

The students will be receiving a schedule that outlines when each part is due. They will be typing their essays on Google Classroom, so I am able to edit and help guide them through the draft process while they are working. Students should be regularly checking Google Classroom for project updates and instructions on upcoming portions of the project. The first item that will need to be returned by Wednesday, December 21st is a consent form with your approval of your child's topic. Also, on the consent form you will approve to take your child to the New Lenox Public Library if necessary for research material.
