Pillar of the Month

October

Responsibility

Words, words, words!

The following are simple activities that will build your child's phonemic awareness:
(we do similar activities here at school daily)

*Choose a 3-letter word, such as cap. Have your youngster substitute other beginning sounds to make new words such as nap, tap, sap, zap, etc. Ask your child to use the new word correctly in a sentence.

*Pick a long word, and have your child determine the number of syllables in the word. You may need to explain the difference between syllables and sounds to our youngest students. One way other than clapping out syllables is to put your hand on your chin and every time it drops, it's a syllable. Try it with mozzarella. Did you get 4?

*Ask your child to say a word without the first sound. For example: say sit without the /s/.

Increase your child's working vocabulary by using real terminology instead of fun or fuzzy words. If it's an adjective, call it such. If it's a noun, remind them what a noun is, but call it a noun. If the dentist says, 'molar' then explain the word and use it. When in a restaurant, explain the word, 'entrée'. Our children are like sponges waiting to soak up all the knowledge that they can. It's part of our job to expose to them to more and more and more!



Communication Corner

October words to practice and talk about are: Fall, October, Leaves, Raking, Pumpkin, Carving, Seeds, Jack-o-lantern, Halloween, Costume, Trick or Treat, Thank you, Spooky, Flashlights, Safety, Ghost, Bats, Football, Helmet, Cheering, Cheerleading, Baseball, Glove, Bat, World Series, Red, Yellow, Orange, Brown, parades, Columbus day, Christopher Columbus, Nina, Pinta, Santa Maria, Discovery, Exploring.

This month, try taking time out and go for a walk on the walking trail/around your neighborhood. While you are walking, talk about things you see, the crunch of the leaves, what happens to the leaves/trees in the fall. Enjoy nature to its fullest.

Who should get vaccinated this season?

Everyone 6 months of age and older should get a flu vaccine every season. This recommendation has been in place since February 2010 when CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) voted for "universal" flu vaccination in the United States to expand protection against the flu to more people. Vaccination to prevent influenza is particularly important for people who are at high risk of serious complications from influenza.

What flu viruses does this season's vaccine protect against?

For 2020-2021, cell- or recombinant-based vaccines are recommended to contain:

- A/Hawaii/70/2019 (H1N1)pdm09-like virus (updated)
- A/Hong Kong/45/2019 (H3N2)-like virus (updated)
- B/Washington/02/2019 (B/Victoria lineage)-like virus (updated)
- B/Phuket/3073/2013-like (Yamagata lineage) virus

Persons with Egg Allergy

- Persons who are able to eat lightly cooked egg (e.g., scrambled egg) without reaction are unlikely to be egg-allergic.
- Persons who have experienced only hives after exposure to egg should receive any licensed, recommended, age-appropriate influenza vaccine (i.e., IIV, RIV4, or LAIV4).
- Persons reporting symptoms other than hives after exposure to egg (such as angioedema, respiratory distress, lightheadedness, or recurrent emesis; or who required epinephrine or another emergency medical intervention) may also receive any licensed and recommended influenza vaccine that is otherwise appropriate.
 - Additionally, for these persons, vaccine should be administered in an inpatient or outpatient medical setting and supervised by a health care provider who is able to recognize and manage severe allergic reactions.
- A previous severe allergic reaction to influenza vaccine, regardless of the component suspected of causing the reaction, is a contraindication to future receipt of the vaccine.

*****October 15th is our State of Illinois compliance date for all grade levels. All immunizations, physicals, and vision exams need to be completed and documentation to the school by then. If your student needs one of the previous items, I would have contacted you by now.***

Our 2nd grade families need a dental form turned in by MAY 15th.

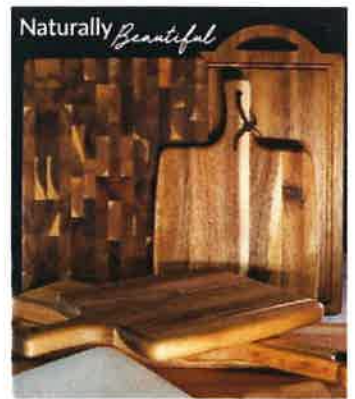

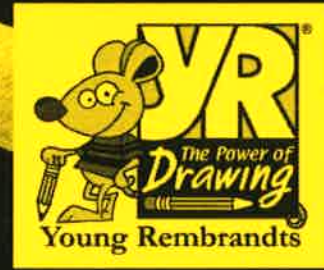
